Across the Borough, many local organisations are working side by side as part of the St Helens Borough Community Food Providers Alliance to create innovative food projects that support individuals and families.

By working together—community groups, charities, and the public sector—we're making sure that everyone has access to delicious, nutritious, and affordable food. From sharing surplus food to promoting smart shopping and cooking, our initiatives help people stretch their budgets while cutting down on waste.

What is the difference ?

Food Bank

Our network of food banks provides emergency food and compassionate, dignified support to people locked in crisis. We have food banks which are connected with The Trussell Trust along with a food bank which is independent and can provide you with 3 days of essential food.

Community Food Pantry

Pantries operate as a member-led neighbourhood hub and are just like a shop, in that you choose the food you want from the shelves. Members pay a small subscription of £5 each week they visit and in return can choose groceries worth many times more, often saving up to £1,000 a year on shopping bills. A Pantry is:

- **Member-run:** Pantries operate along cooperative lines, and many volunteers are members too.
- **Open to all:** You don't need a referral - anyone who lives in an area served by a Pantry can join. Members can only join one pantry.
- **Long-lasting:** You can join for as long as you want, and can choose to go every week or just occasionally.

Surplus Food Share

This type of food provision is similar to a pantry in that it is a great way to reduce food waste.

Collections of surplus foods take place each day (very often late in the evening) from places such as supermarkets. These foods are too good to go in landfill, some do have a USE BY DATE of the same day so needs to be distributed before the end of that day. This means food is only available a few short hours in the evening.

Community Coffee Shop/Cafe

We have numerous community cafes and coffee shops, however, the ones we have included in this directory also offer a PAY IT FORWARD scheme. Customers can choose to donate to help others who are in financial hardship who can go along and ask for a meal and a drink under that scheme.

How to access

The most important step is to get a foodbank VOUCHER. In order to provide the most appropriate help for the circumstances of your situation we work with local agencies. Agencies we work with include: Citizens Advice, housing support officers, children's centres, health visitors, social services and some local charities. If you call our foodbank we can talk through your situation and put you in touch with a relevant local agency. They will issue you with a VOUCHER which you will then need to bring to agreed foodbank.

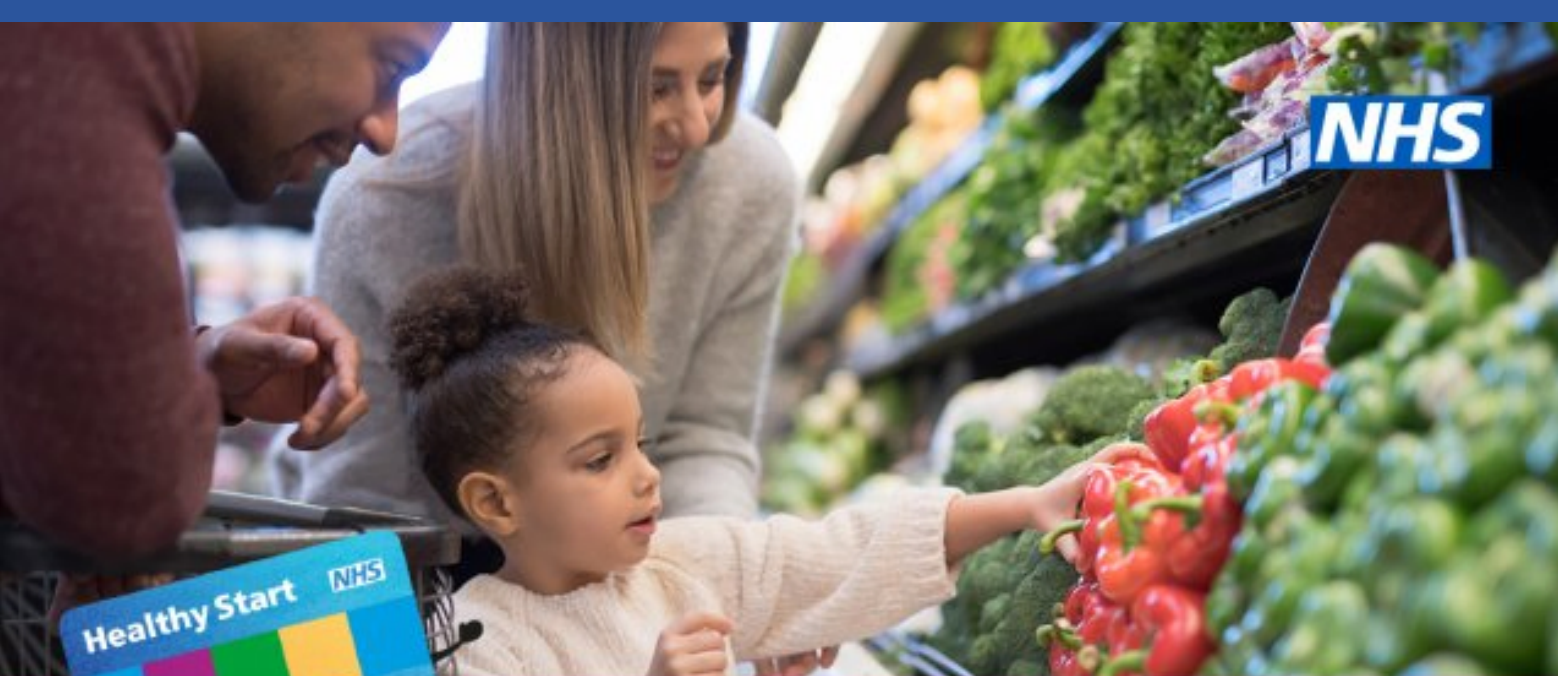
The Henry Programme

Being a parent can be tough – HENRY is here to help! The Henry Programme offers a diverse range of events, ranging from day sessions to 8-week programmes. Each event is designed to support families to enjoy a healthier, happier start in life.

To see if you're eligible
for Healthy Start visit:
www.healthystart.nhs.uk

The NHS Healthy Start scheme helps young families and those who are pregnant to access healthy food, milk and vitamins.

The scheme is available in England, Wales and Northern Ireland.

People may be eligible if they have responsibility for at least one child under the age of four or are more than 10 weeks pregnant.

Eligibility also depends on the benefit the person receives and what their income is. People apply for the scheme online and get a prepaid card, which they can use to buy healthy food and milk. They can also get free Healthy Start vitamins.

The prepaid card can be used in most places that sell eligible healthy food and milk items and accept Mastercard®. The card is topped up every four weeks with their payments. Once on the scheme, people will get:

- £4.25 each week of their pregnancy (from the 10th week of pregnancy)
- £8.50 each week for children from birth to one year old
- £4.25 each week for children between one and four years old
